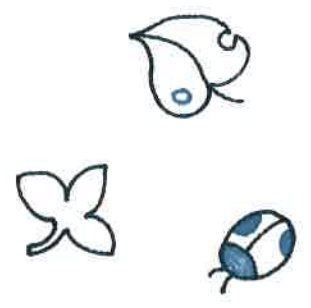
Just like a forest, the internet needs diversity to thrive. Today, however, most of the internet is owned by a few big companies. But it doesn't have to be this way...
